Golda Meir: Iron Lady of the Middle East

This video talks about the remarkable and also complicated legacy of Golda Meir. Israel's only female premier was beloved by her nation but had her reputation tarnished to an extent with the outcomes of the Yom Kippur War. In this episode and through this educator's guide, students will explore and reflect upon Golda Meir's life, her successes and her failures. Students will be asked to consider what truly makes someone a hero. Is it someone infallible? Students will also think through Golda Meir's early life in which she made sacrifices for her Zionism, making the decision to immigrate to Israel from the U.S.

Review - Did the students understand the material?

Discussion Questions

- **1.** We saw Golda Meir leaving behind her comfortable life in America for a difficult one in the pre-state of Israel. Why would Golda leave behind the familiar for the unknown and foreign?
- 2. How would history look different if Golda Meir and Israel did not merely have observer status at the Evian Conference, but were active participants?
- 3. In what way was Golda Meir's African project such an important part of her expression of Zionism?





- **4.** When the <u>Agranat Commission</u> cleared Golda Meir of wrongdoing, she still resigned after it was released. Do you admire her for this or disagree with her decision?
- **5.** What do you think Golda Meir could have done differently for the Mizrahi community, if anything, and why?

Reflection Questions

- **1.** If you were given an hour to sit down with Golda Meir, what are three questions you would ask her?
- 2. Is it possible for you to have deep reverence for a leader while acknowledging their imperfections, or do you expect your leaders to be mostly infallible?
- 3. Which of Golda Meir's values do you personally admire the most, and why?
